City of Lauderdale Lakes Appoints Treasa Brown Stubbs as the New City Manager

The City of Lauderdale Lakes City Commission voted to appoint Treasa Brown Stubbs as the new City Manager during the City Commission meeting on April 25, 2023. The decision was made after a four to one vote of the Board of Commissioners.

"This is something I did not aspire to be, but I'm thankful to God that this has been in my path. So I thank you (Mayor and Commissioners) for the opportunity to serve in this capacity. We have a lot of work to do and I think we can take this City to amazing adventures, amazing places, and we're here to do the work," said Brown Stubbs upon accepting the position as City Manager.

As the City's top administrator, her principal responsibilities include effectively accomplishing the policy objectives set forth by the City Commission in a productive manner; directing and controlling all administrative issues; providing for the professional management of day-to-day City operations and service provision; and the development of the annual budget.

"I have worked with you (Treasa Brown Stubbs) since 2016 when I became a city commissioner and always known you to be forthright and caring about the city of Lauderdale Lakes. The City of Lauderdale Lakes is your passion and calling and you want to see us do well, be the best city in Broward County and the state of Florida. Thank you for always being there for the city of Lauderdale Lakes," said Mayor Edwards Phillips during her remarks at the Commission meeting.



The City of Lauderdale Lakes was incorporated on June 22, 1961, by the Florida State Legislature. Since incorporation, the City has developed into a vibrant, urban community boasting economic growth and diversity. Today, the City population is more than 36,647, representing African-American, Caribbean, European, Latino, Native American, Asian, and Pacific Islander cultures.

Treasa holds a bachelor's degree from Florida Agricultural & Mechanical (FAMU) University and a Master's in Public Administration from Nova Southeastern University. Treasa Brown Stubbs is a visionary leader that prides herself in taking a vision and making it a reality through sound strategic development. She received a Master's Certificate for completing the High-Performance Leadership Professional Development Academy through the International City/County Management Association (ICMA), a graduate of the National Forum for Black Public Administrators (NFBPA) Executive Leadership Institute (ELI), and is also a Certified Parks and Recreation Professional through the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA).
